<u>Calls of significance:</u> Captain Moran on his day off and FF Luna responded to Switzerland Trail to rescue a family that has been living in tents and needed to get to a warmer area.

Emergent to Eldora for open leg fractures because Eldora didn't have a paramedic.

Chopper go at Eldora for a patient that hit a tree.

Ran 11 carbon monoxide/ fire alarms.

7 rollover/ car and motorcycle accidents.

Report of a person in the water at Barker Res, no one was found just rocks.

Contractor hit a gas line in town.

Responded to assist Sugarloaf at a car crash and had to help move patients since AMR couldn't get to the scene because they didn't have a 4x4 ambulance.

Patient with potential critical injury from an excavator. From the time the 911 call taker answered the phone to us transporting emergently to BCH was 12 minutes with a 4 minute scene time. Town was very thankful for our prompt response and professional care.



Responded to an Airbnb for alarms during a wedding. Once the problem was solved a round of clapping by the wedding party for the fire crew.

Frequent calls to an at risk elderly person that caused her to be enrolled in our budding community paramedic program. We are working with the patients PCP and protection services as well as co responders to find a good path for in home care.

Boulder Canyon closed due to several crashes and traffic control as well multiple vehicles being winched out.

Emergent to Eldora for a patient that struck a tree. They ended up going via helicopter

Operations/ Wildland

Vehicles:

5630 (UTV) is finished!

5631 will begin the pump change next week.

5651 (Tacoma) had new rear springs installed.

5624, 5602 and 5601 had battery chargers installed for portable lights.

5654 sustained an injury to a side mirror.

Staffing:

Nick Faes has begun his full-time employment as Captain at NFPD

We have finished captain interviews, have extended a job offer and have received back the signed acceptance of that offer.

We have hired Jessi Scrivner as a PRN Fire fighter/Medic. She has worked as a paramedic and a wildland medic at Denver Health and a fire medic at Auora Fire and is currently working at South Metro Fire. She is excited to start here and the new challenges that Nederland Fire can bring.

Operations:

Currently working with chiefs at BCFFA for grant funding for 25 Radios from 1B funding. Currently we are asking for 1.1 million out of 1B money for radios. Nederland Fire is requesting 106,150.00 out of this grant.

I finished one on one interviews with all the volunteers and was very pleased with the



feedback from the volunteers.

We hosted a large agency meeting and dinner. We discussed future plans, our current concerns, volunteer feedback from the one-on-one meetings and new expectations. Great thanks to Joe Luna with the help of some other volunteers who helped cook and our administrator who helped get all the food.

We received a CORA request from a resident requesting information relating to anything with their name in it, we didn't have much information, but what we had was provided.

Fire Marshal Joslin has received several emails relating to the Big Springs Egress. He has answered several questions and tried to reemphasize that this is not a Nederland Fire project but a Town of Nederland. Sadly, one email stated they are "experiencing open hostility from the community" relating to the egress route.

In researching the Egress route project, we discovered that a former chief was actively engaged in the project and made recommendations to potentially use private property. Later, he rescinded and recommended alternative routes that avoided using private property. Additionally, the NFPD board had stated in a previous board meeting that Nederland Fire has no opinion on the egress route.

While this is true, Fire Marshal Joslin and I have been approached by JVA and The Town of Nederland for opinions. There are 3 pieces of information that we have offered referencing the egress route. 1. Yes, there needs to be an egress. 2. The egress route needs to follow the County Multimodal Code and 3. The further east the route is, the better the opportunities for egress for more people.

After reviewing all this information, we decided to contact our legal counsel to ensure our communications with the concerned resident were clear and correct.

After our discussion with our attorney, he recommended having a meeting with the resident. I agreed with the attorney and thought it would be prudent to have the Town of Nederland present. After I discussed this topic with the town, they stated that since it was their project that they would host the meeting and invite us. The town was very clear with me that this is the Town of Nederland's project and not the fire departments. I am waiting to hear back from the town about the meeting.

EMS Div Cost Control:

- Pursuing grant funding for loose ambulance goods to help offset ambulance cost
- Medication inventory control
- Pursuing grant funding for transport ventilator and digital laryngoscopes

EMS Education:

- Hosting county-wide EMS skills Rodeo this weekend
- CPR instructor class and community classes
- Certified 7 new CPR instructors.
- Members and recruits have certified or recertified in CPR
- Planning spring EMR class at request of Boulder Mountain and other agencies.

Training:

- Assuring all members pertinent certs are current and using the state of Colorado program Salamander to improve certification tracking
- Found instructor for internal Hazmat training, former member Anthony Desalvo.
- Local Nurse Mid-Wife contacted who is excited to teach at skills rodeo and/or training at Nederland Fire
- Working to find pathway to certify sawyers internally
- Developed and delivered RIT classroom training and Hazmat JPR training
- I proctored State firefighter 1 tests at Galeton Fire and Pierce Ault Fire this weekend.

Medical Community Risk Reduction/Community Paramedicine:

- Assisting three Nederland residents who have been identified as high need patients with access to support and finding social services
- Networking with local health and human services agencies/caseworkers/ and providers
- Improving local access Narcan and fentanyl

Critical Care Certification:

- Received preliminary approval from our Medical Director to pursue critical care scope of
 practice for our critical care certified medics, this will allow a slew of advanced
 procedures without the state waiver program.
- Contacted EMS director of Clear Creek EMS (Aaron Crawley) and Colorado Critical Care Paramedic of the Year (Joseph Blunn) to assist with protocol development and program creation. Both have been very helpful and great resources who have committed to support Nederland Fire in this endeavor.

Fire Marshal Board Report - November 2023



Inspections:

Several business inspections were completed, including one performed by Lt. Sweeney, who was impressed by how easy to use First Due was for the inspection and how it guides the inspection process for you. This was a good test run the implementation of company-level inspections next year.

We have a few compliance issues in town that are currently being addressed. Fire Watch was issued at multiple locations; one business chose to self-evacuate the building and replace a problematic alarm system – it is set to go back online Thursday. Another building was issued a "Stop Work Order", and the building was evacuated when it was found to not be performing Fire Watch as required with their sprinkler system out of service – they are currently working on repairing the HVAC systems so they can bring the sprinkler and alarm systems back online. Another business has a couple of deficiencies that are being addressed with their systems – the owner and manager have been very responsive; it should be resolved within the coming days.

Projects:

First Due -

Pre-plans are still being completed with each business inspection, getting close to finishing the entire district, estimated to have them completed by Q1-Q2 2024.

Invoicing & Permitting modules will be implemented in Q1-Q2 2024, the depth of the permitting will depend on the approval of a new fee schedule.

Responder module is currently being setup for CAD integration, there are some quirks with the parsing of data at the moment. BCSO communications is working with First Due to correct, they might have a fix with copying a similar format from other agencies in the county using First Due.

Wildland Pre-Plans -

Worked with Chief Ondr and Ember Alliance to compile a list of each dataset for each map layer for both Strategic and Tactical level maps. We are really close to getting a working product and are on target for Q1 release.

Ongoing Activities:

Attended FLC Fire Marshal's Symposium, had a great time, networked with a lot of people, and I learned a lot!

Preliminary draft of STR fire code has been completed; including fire pits, should the Town allow them – signs point to them wanting to ban them in certain situations (vacation rentals where the owners are not on the premises).

Congratulations to the winner of the FPW Art Contest, 1st grader Mani (artwork attached).

First draft of the 2023 Fee Schedule Update is completed.

Helped arrange a training lead by Xcel Energy and their contractors regarding the new battery bank installation behind the community center. Feedback has been positive; I will be attending it this Friday with Chief.

Chili Cook-Off at Very Nice Brewing – November 19th – proceeds go to NFPD, we'll have representatives there as judges and to assist.
