Calls of significance:

CPR call at Eldora, Pt pronounced on scene

Skier vs tree at Eldora, We were heavily involved in patient care, patient was flown to BCH. Pt survived.

Active CO Alarm, Capt Benson responded status 1.

Auto vs train, mutual aid with Gilpin No major injuries

Dk person in creek on Caribou, Patient was hypothermic, missing a shoe and walking in water /snow in 3 degree weather, the patient began to get very agitated and took 4 officers to control.

Took a critical patient from Columbine health after calling a cardiac alert and transporting under our new emergent transport policy. This saved the patient approximately 30 minutes on door to cardiac catheterization time and cardiac alert confirmed by ED MD and on-call Cardiologist. Assisted by Mandi P. and driven by Eric A, Conor M. attending.

We have seen a significant increase in mutual aid calls with Timberline this month.

Operations/ Wildland

RT 130 held at Station 1, 15 people attended. Thanks to Jamie Carpenter, Eric Abramson and Rik Henrikson for teaching.

New Wildland gear has been received and distributed from last years House Bill non-competitive grant, Thanks to Marcia and Larissa for completing that huge task! 5617's generator which was said to be repaired, is now repaired. Front Range fire apparatus came up and repaired it at the station. While Front Range was here we had



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them fix the Telma retarder on 5601.

5617 Got new tires. Scott Papich helped oversee the work, the lugs that hold the hub caps on broke, so no hubcaps but still a great improvement.

5621 has been looked at by the mechanic for the leaking steering box, a new box has been ordered, repair to happen soon.

Broken window on 5651 (Tacoma) has been repaired.

Steel doors and the steel roof have been installed on the new UTV.

We sold the old red raft hanging on the wall.

We began tackling the overflowing bunker gear room, moved some shelves from station 3 and purchased some storage bins for responders to be able to keep gear in that doesn't fit. Thanks to Ken and Conor for the help with this.

I defended the Ambulance Grant with the Foothills Retac this am (4.19.23)

Listened to the Boulder County Commissioners discuss 1a and 1b Tax ballot.

Worked with Fire Marshal Joslin on a new hat design.

Repaired the flag pole

Work installing the new pump on 5632 continues.

In discussions with a part time mechanic about blocking out 1-2 days a week to work on our vehicles on a permanent basis.

Have been in contact with a fire- mechanic at Castle Rock to possibly do the pump/tank conversion on 5631. I am supposed to meet with him this week.

Safety/ Training

<u>Total documented monthly training hours completed in January:</u> 47 hours

- District fire trainings completed:
- Fire training for the month of March focused heavily on introduction and fine tuning of oriented search methods. Search training occurred on 3/11 and 3/25 at station 1. These trainings ensured that our FF's and Officers are properly synced to perform the critical task of searching for a victim of a structure fire. Unfortunately, the training that was scheduled to occur at the BOCO training center had to be relocated to station 1 due to staffing issues.
- Lt. Joslin attended a fire behavior class through CFI.

- Rik Henrikson and Charlie attended UTV certification class with the Sheriffs office and are certified to use the UTV for wildland calls on federal fires.



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Large training project updates

- FF's M. Papich, S. Papich and Larissa Briscombe have been enrolled in FF-II academy which begins in early may.
- We have 4 Probationary FF's attending wildland fire academy with Timberline FD starting April 15th

EMS

Dea Licensing transferred out of Mike Scott's name.

Nederland and Sugarloaf EMS education program director role taken by Cap'n' Moran.

Completed delivering EMR course and NREMT Psychomotor testing, many positive reports from students and home agencies. 5 Ned Fire members made it through the class and represented the agency well. Many folks from the EMR class reported interest in the EMT class and future Ems education opportunities at Nederland fire. Mandi P. and Corey S. helped teach and we got great feedback from students about them.

Demo of C-mac video laryngoscope and collected info on grant funding.

Researching grant funding for 3-4 additional AEDs.

Created and delivered a member survey for chief selection process.

Sheparded several members through NREMT Renewal process.

On-going communication with Sherriff's office regarding creating a training on the county's new MCI plan.

Meeting and ongoing follow-up with carepoint sales rep to demo several EMS training manakins one of which the funding will be supplied for by George Newell as a donation to futher EMS education at Ned fire. We have narrowed it down to the model and awaiting finalized pricing from sales rep. This will be the cornerstone of the planned ambulance simulator at Nederland Fire.

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Fire Marshal

Routine Inspections & Plan Reviews:

10 annual business fire safety inspections completed, 2 food truck renewals, and a handful of new business inspections completed.

Working with Town closely on a few construction projects to ensure adequate water supply and hydrants are available as required by the Fire Code.

Have 1 business with multiple deficiencies (fire alarm & sprinkler system), new management, working with property owner to ensure timely correction and that the reports are properly filed into The Compliance Engine.

Multiple new plan reviews, residential and commercial, including a 44,000+ sq ft mixed-use building.

Projects:

Addressing – appropriate code suggestions finalized, no change in Fire Code required. Meeting with Town Planning Committee later in April to bring suggestions so that the entire District will have the same requirements in place.

Based on the IFC 2018, municipal code, and Wildfire Partner and County recommendations, here's what we're currently going for:

- A reflective sign
- 4" minimum characters
- ½" minimum stroke
- White lettering
- Green background (County allows Blue as well)
- Attached to a metal t-post, or non-combustible approved means
- 4-6' above the grade of the road

Some sort of exception for mounting directly on the residence/building that is within x-feet from the public way (working with Town for suggestions on this).



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Wildland Pre-Plans – still compiling data sets, working with First Due has helped with this, District to be broken into appropriate Tactical and Strategic sections that don't conflict/conform to County emergency polygons, but rather incorporates them into the pre-plans.

First Due – met with First Due team weekly to implement businesses, address points, and GIS data, as well as incorporating our Fire Code and Town Ordinances for inspections and code violations. First Due has been very proactive and helpful with creating checklists and reports.

<u>Computer software/IT</u>: Sherry is trying to change Quickbooks ownership from Kathy and has been having a hard time with that. It seems very difficult to get ahold of people at intuit.
